Hide your face from my sins, and blot out all my iniquities. Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a right spirit within me. Cast me not away from your presence, and take not your Holy Spirit from me. Restore to me the joy of your salvation, and uphold me with a willing spirit. Then I will teach transgressors your ways, and sinners will return to you (Psalm 51:9-13).

We are saved! We are justified before God and for the sake of Jesus, our sins are forgiven. Our old Adam has died with Christ and we are raised with Him to eternal life. These are this things we as Christians like to focus on, and rightly so. But there is something here that we too easily overlook. While saved, justified, and forgiven, we remain sinners. February 22 is Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent. This is the time of year, the church especially focuses on the issue of repentance. During Lent we prepare ourselves for Holy Week and Easter. This season brings into focus what we so easily forget the rest of the year. We forget that we are at once both justified and sinner.

Our ongoing sin is often the source of both confusion and doubt. We believe that Jesus died for our sins. We trust that through faith in Jesus Christ we are made new, and yet we still sin. Does that mean that we're not saved? Does that mean that our sin no longer matters? "What shall we say then? Are we to continue in sin that grace may abound" (Romans 6:1)? Neither is true. We are at once both justified and sinner. We do sin every day and it is right that

this sin should trouble us. It is also right that we should seek to live each day without sin, though we will fail. It is in this struggle that the Gospel is seen afresh in this world. Our salvation came not by the path of glory, but by the way of the cross. Our redemption was purchased not through power and might, but through humiliation, suffering, and death. When we as the body of Christ face the daily humiliation of our sin, daily suffer the anguish of our sin, and daily seek to put that sin to death in our lives, we too walk the way of the cross. It is though this struggle that the Holy Spirit proclaims the Good News of salvation to others – who like us – daily suffer in sin. In the Gospel of Luke, Jesus tells us, "If anyone would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow me."

We are saved by grace, through faith in Jesus Christ, not through our ability to be free of sin. We should never lose sight of the fact that – though redeemed by the blood of Jesus from the power of sin – we still sin. We daily turn away from God to our own flesh and we daily need to return to God. We daily need to seek afresh the forgiveness of sins that is ours through Jesus Christ.

Jesus came into Galilee, proclaiming the gospel of God, and saying, "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand; repent and believe in the gospel." (Mark 1:14-15).
