Pioneer Lutheran Council Minutes February 2012


"And when you pray, do not heap up empty phrases as the *Gentiles do, for they think that they will be heard for their* many words. Do not be like them, for your Father knows what you need before you ask him" (Matthew 6:7-8). During Lenten services this year, we will be exploring the role of prayer in the life of the believer through Luther's treatment of the Lord's Prayer in the Large Catechism. Jesus, in chapter 6 of Matthew, calls prayer a 'Practice of Righteousness' or what we as Lutheran's might call a good work. We are not saved through any good work we do – even prayer – but entirely through God's free gift of faith. So, why pray? According to Luther, "it is our duty to pray because of God's commandment. For thus we heard in the Second Commandment: Thou shalt not take the name of the Lord, thy God, in vain, that we are there required to praise that holy name, and call upon it in every need, or to pray" (BoC, Large Catechism 3.5). You see, for each commandment there is both a negative and positive application. When we curse, swear, lie, use sorcery, or deceive by His name, we violate the Second Commandment. And likewise, when we call upon his name in every trouble, pray, praise, and give thanks, we obey the Second Commandment.

So, this is why we should pray, but why would God wish us to pray? It is not like He needs our prayers. God receives no power or sustenance from prayer. God is not ignorant of what we need and awaiting our guidance in how best to help us. Neither is God waiting to be placated through prayer before He might be disposed to help us. God does not wait for us to beg. God loves us, knows what we need, and graciously supplies our need without our asking or even knowing – simply because He loves us. So why would God command us to pray? Not because He needs our prayers, but because we need to pray. We read in the Apology to the Augsburg Confession that "when by faith we have received the Holy Spirit, the fulfilling of the Law necessarily follows, by which love, patience, chastity, and other fruits of the Spirit gradually grow."

We need to pray, because – through prayer – we learn to rely upon God in every situation. We learn to trust Him for every need. Through prayer, the fruits of the Spirit gradually grow within us. Through prayer, we begin to become the way God intended us to be. Through faith in Jesus Christ's death and resurrection, God not only justifies and grants to us eternal life, He restores us – in Christ – to relationship with Him. In prayer we participate in that relationship with our heavenly Father established in Christ's death and realized in His resurrection. This Lent, I encourage each of you to devote yourselves to prayer.
