"I, the LORD, have called you in righteousness; I will take hold of your hand. I will keep you and will make you to be a covenant for the people and a light for the Gentiles, to open eyes that are blind, to free captives from prison and to release from the dungeon those who sit in darkness" (Isaiah 42:6-7).

I just got back from the St. Dysmas worship service at the South Dakota State Penitentiary and was struck by two facts. First, though St. Dysmas in in a prison, there are precisely the same percentage of sinners there as there are at Pioneer Lutheran Church (100%). Second, at St. Dysmus one cannot pretend to be something other than a sinner. One must where the sign of there sinfulness on their person. They are all wore clothes that were clearly labeled "INMATE." And while, I am not suggesting that we adopt a similar dress code at Pioneer Lutheran Church, I do think that this is – in an odd sense – liberating.

Every week we say the words, "we confess that we are in bondage to sin and cannot free ourselves." How often to we really think about these words as we speak them? Do we really believe them to be true, or do we really mean 'we confess that we really aren't that bad, that were basically good people and God will see that we're good enough.' Do you really believe you are in bondage to sin? According to God's Word, we are. Each one of us is just as imprisoned to sin as any one of those men at St. Dysmas. They simply lack the illusion of they own innate goodness. They have no choice but accept that they are sinners. Like Hester Prynne in the Scarlet Letter, they where the mark of their sin for all to see.

Every man, woman, and child on this earth is in bondage to sin and there has only ever been one person free of this bondage and we hung Him on a cross, but this is what God intended. It is through the suffering, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ that God frees us from our bondage and we – though in bondage to sin in our flesh – are now clothed in the freedom and righteousness of Jesus Christ. Imagine what it would mean to any of those men at St. Dysmas to be able to exchange those clothes labeled "INMATE" for clothes labeled "FREE."

"I needed clothes and you clothed me, I was sick and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came to visit me." (Matthew 25:36).
