Bulletin preparations: Council will direct Life and Spirit to produce the weekly bulletins. Others can help.


Woodchuck situation: Kevin and Laura alerted Council that it could cause damage to the storage shed.

In closing, the Lord's Prayer was prayed.



Dear Friends in Christ,

We recently sang the hymn "I Love to Tell the Story" in worship and my heart is still swelling from the experience. As our voices lifted in praise, we sang one verse acapella and my soul promised to always remember the moment. My only regret is we didn't have time to each share how the story of Jesus has impacted our lives and how we live that love in our daily lives.

The words to this beloved hymn were penned by Katherine Hankey who grew up in the family of a wealthy English banker associated with the evangelical wing of the Anglican Church. As a teenager she taught

a girls' Sunday school class. She later traveled to South Africa to serve as a nurse and to assist her invalid brother.

While recovering from a lengthy illness of her own at age 30, she wrote a poem entitled *The Story Told* in 1868 and it was later put to a musical setting by William Fischer in 1869. Hankey's passion about the story of Jesus and how it changed her life is evident in the personal, intimate language she uses.

It really is remarkable that a hymn written one hundred and fifty-four years ago continues to speak our truth as believers while lifting our voices and hearts in a little country church in the Midwest on a beautiful summer Sunday morning. Why does the hymn continue to inspire? I believe it's because we do love to tell the story of Jesus and his love! We tell it every day through our actions, our prayers, and our love. We tell it through our giving and volunteering. We tell it through the spiritual gifts God blessed us with. It's hard if not impossible to sing the hymn without smiling!

As we bask in the beauty of God's creation these summer days, may we reflect

on all the ways Jesus and His love has shaped and changed our lives. It's staggering really to think about the countless ways, isn't it? I love to tell the story, because I know 'tis true; it satisfies my longings as nothing else can do.

It was a very meaningful evening, and we thank God we are able to reach out to those who are incarcerated. Please consider joining us on future visits to St. Dysmas.


