PIONEER LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING August 3, 2022

AUGUST 2022

President Valerie Hicks opened the meeting of Pioneer's Church Council at 6 pm on August 3, 2022. Charlotte Mickelson was present via cell phone and Bill Powers was absent. Pastor Teri Johnson opened the meeting with a prayer. The secretary's report of the July 7, 2022, meeting was read by Julie Petersen in Charlotte's absence. Kevin Quail made a motion to approve, and Laura Quail seconded, the motion passed. The treasurer's report was presented by Julie and reviewed. It was noted that the lawn was mowed four times in June not twice. Laura made a motion to approve the treasurer's report and Kevin seconded, the motion passed.

OLD BUSINESS

Membership List: Patty Thompson and Laura Quail met to finalize the membership list and church record book. The membership document was sent to Val Hicks to finalize for the church directory. It was discussed to send a letter to all Pioneer members indicating we are updating our records and need verification of correct contact information.

Outreach Committee

We will offer a Bible study of the Women of the Bible beginning Saturday, September 10, from 9 to 10:30 am at the church every other Saturday for 12 Saturdays. Charlotte Mickelson, Karen Ronne and Laura Quail met to begin planning. Laura Quail

applied for a Thrivent Action grant and was approved to purchase the Study Guides that will be used as well as food for refreshments. Laura will order the Study Guide when the grant money is received. Charlotte, Karen, Laura and MJ Powers will meet again to plan the first lesson.

Pioneer Days Float: Thallis Jensen had a wonderful time with Val Hicks, MJ Powers and Patty Thompson riding in the horse drawn cart through the parade. Thank you, Val, for providing your horses and equipment for this fun entry.

The annual Fall Festival will be held Sunday, September 18, beginning at 4 pm. There will be a suggested donation for the

meal. Val Hicks will have her ponies and cart available for rides. Dana Crooks will organize the silent auction and Kevin Quail will auction for the live auction. ALL CHURCH MEMBERS are asked to provide a pie for the meal.

Facilities Committee

Dear Friends in Christ,

I recently officiated a funeral for a beautiful lady who told her children days before she died: "What a wonderful life I've had! I only wish I'd realized it sooner."

All of us know about learning life's lessons through pain, struggle, and loss. But few of us realize that it is often the gentlest lessons that teach us most. There is a story about a family vacationing at a beach resort. One afternoon there was a surprise activity for the children: a ride on an elephant around the resort parking lot. The family's youngest daughter was delirious with excitement. That night, as her parents tucked her into bed, her mother said, "Life is always full of wonderful surprises if we're open to them." To which the little girl replied, "Yes, like some mornings waking up not knowing what will happen during the day and then getting to ride an elephant."

Life is open to wonderful surprises.... God surprises...if we're open to them. Unfortunately, that is never my first thought as I open my eyes each morning and make my way to my coffee maker. Instead, my mind immediately goes to the day's schedule...all the tasks that need to be done. Usually, my calendar is full which unfortunately means I have no time to be surprised much less open to God.

If we are willing to learn our lessons gently, they patiently await us in countless ways. In these closing days of summer may we try listening to the wisdom of children; accepting the loving kindness of a friend; reaching out to those in need; asking a colleague for advice; acting on our intuition; observing how our pets live so contentedly in the present moment; rediscovering the surprising healing power of spontaneity; focusing on the good in any situation we are experiencing; expecting the best of every day; and realizing what a wonderful life we're living, sooner rather than later. Of course, the unexpected often catches us by surprise. But if we are open to and grateful to God for the gentle lessons, we will surely find and know God in the unexpected moments. May we be open to God's daily visits and lessons.
