NEW BUSINESS


- 1. Confirmation Class being arranged by Teri with Preston Reed.

Dear Friends in Christ,

I recently experienced an excruciatingly long day awaiting news on my dog's surgery as she was having a pacemaker put in. Yes, our dog is the first in the family to have a cardiologist! We dropped Daisy off at the animal hospital at 6:30 am the morning of surgery and in my worried mind I assumed I would hear something by noon. When the lunch hour arrived and I hadn't heard anything I called and the very friendly receptionist politely told me "no news is good news." Fast forward five hours and still having not heard anything, I called again and a new receptionist cheerfully reminded me "no news is good news". By this time, my mind

had determined that "no news was NOT good news; no news was NO news." Alas, by 5:30 pm the vet called to share the good news that surgery had gone well and Daisy was resting in recovery.

The experience got me thinking about the phrase "no news is good news." The definition of the phrase means if you don't hear that something bad has happened, it is probably because nothing bad has happened. The phrase is something people say when they are worried about something to make them feel better. The origin of the expression dates back to King James I of England who said "No news is better than evil news" in the year 1616.

After a very long day of receiving no news...any kind of news....I'm not sure I am believer anymore of the phrase "no news is good news" and started imaging how scripture would have been written if nobody ever shared the good news but instead kept silent under the guise of "no news is good news."

There are over 100 biblical passages about sharing the good news...about speaking up and witnessing. Can you imagine the Christmas story if the angels would have kept silent, telling the frightened shepherds that "no news is good news." Or the Easter story if Mary had run back to the village and instead of sharing the good news of resurrection with the disciples, would have said "hey guys, no news is good news." Or in the Pentecost story if Jesus would have told his disciples NOT to go out and witness in the power of the Holy Spirit but because "no news is good

news." Imagine if the writers of scripture had lived with the belief that people usually only report bad things, not good things. Therefore, if they didn't write about bad things, their audiences could assume everything was going well. Where would we be as a church or as followers of Christ if nobody had ever said a word? A good word? As a disciple of Jesus Christ, I am not a fan of the "no news is good news" sentiment because there is always a glimmer of good news, of hope, of possibility. Where does my confidence come from? It comes from my faith in the God of new birth, in Jesus the way of possibility and in the Holy Spirit the constant presence in every minute of my every day. As disciples of the risen Christ, we are to be bearers of the good news!

May we be empowered to share the good news of what Christ is doing in our lives and in the life of our congregation.


