#### Dear Friends,

Lent is upon us yet started in an unusual way as Mother Nature decided Ash Wednesday wasn't necessary. While Mother Nature might think Ash Wednesday isn't necessary, I beg to differ which won't be the first or last time I disagree with her!

Ash Wednesday is a solemn reminder of our mortality and our need for reconciliation with God. The ash cross placed on our foreheads is meant to represent our mortality and penance for our sins.

One of the scripture readings for this Ash Wednesday was Matthew 6: 21: "Wherever your treasure is, there the desires of your heart will also be." We are not enough. That my simple and depressing to some but it's a fact. But what does understanding our limits tell us about our potential?

The Bible is clear. We discover the most valuable places and parts of our lives when we stop and evaluate our "treasures"—not the monetary, earthly ones, but those areas of our lives that truly, deeply matter to us (or at least they should). For some people, it might be their marriage; for others their children; and still others, their ambitions and possessions. Yet even when we identify these places in our lives, something is still missing. Jesus

was clear that we are not enough, and that he fills a place in us that the world, although it might try, can never fill.

The odd, awkward truth about our rebellion from God is that what causes it is also what heals it. The need, the void where only God fits, that we yearn and struggle to fill with a variety of pleasures, people, places, and pursuits, ultimately has only one true answer---Jesus, our Savior, our Friend, our Example.....our Treasure.

As we begin the journey of Lent, the real question emerges: Are the desires of our hearts born from treasures worth the effort? Or do we seek more, crave more? Are we tired of running, working, reaching, begging for more, and yet never quite getting there?

God wants more for us. God has provided more for us. God, through Jesus, gave more for us. And that is enough.

If Lent is indeed to remind us of our mortality, that from dust we came to dust we shall return, just imagine what God might do when the "dust settles," when we find our place and hand him all of the pieces of the days before.
