Dear Friends in Christ,

We have arrived at Holy Week as we walk the last days of Jesus' earthly life with him. We will share communion remembering how Jesus gave himself in the breaking of the bread and sharing of the cup. We will stand at the foot of the cross confessing our sins, the sins that Jesus died for. We will gather Easter morning celebrating the good news of resurrection. And then what?

For many Easter is a one day event celebrating for an hour the good news that death has been defeated and Christ is alive! For many life goes back to "normal", even life in the church where we talk about the teachings of Jesus, the miracle of new life here and now, and how Jesus lives on in our hearts and minds. But the New Testament--if you are honest with it---centers around one singular fact: not new life out of the old, not moral values or principles, not Jesus as the great example for living, but, rather, that Jesus died and rose again from the dead. Apart from that miraculous fact, there would be no New Testament, no church, no Christian faith, and possibly only the slightest remembrance of Jesus of Nazareth

caught up in a few pages of some musty history of ancient Jewish religion.


And without that central fact in the New Testament, I'd really have nothing to say to you. But because Jesus died and rose again, I do have something to say! I can say to those who are growing old, those who are dying, those who are lost, that God has been there, in the darkness, in the despair, in the loneliness, in the death—and all is well! Darkness and death do not have the last word. The end is not death but life.

One big danger, however, in talking about death and resurrection is to leave it as an abstraction---true for everybody and therefore true for nobody. We must make the resurrection of Jesus personal and in doing so, professing Christ risen and alive in our hearts.

So here we are in April with winter storm watches on our radars and nothing in nature to speak to us of new life and the flowering of hope. But as Christians, as believers, we can still sing out our hallelujahs because God reigns with power and conviction! Therefore, "We should not grieve like the rest of men, who have no hope. We believe that Jesus died...and rose again; and so it will be for those who died as Christians; God will bring them to life with Jesus." Praise God!
