Friends in Christ,

A few months ago while leaving a large store in Sioux Falls, Marty and I ran into a colleague of mine whom I hadn't seen in years. I was delighted to see my 94-year-old friend in such good health and spirits and as we talked, I learned that his wife had died within the last year and the next day would be her birthday as well as Mother's Day. Spending those moments with my friend was the highlight of my day.

The next week I received a note which read: "My anxiety was already starting to

build with Mother's Day and Evelyn's birthday on the same day. For me to share a bit with you and Marty gave me a sense of peace. For me, it was providential that our paths crossed that day at a busy department store."

The definition of the word 'providential' is: "involving divine foresight or intervention." How often does God's providence burst into our busy lives and we don't even notice? We use words like "coincidence" or "unbelievable" or say things like "what are the chances?" God, our heavenly Father, is always watching over us and intervening in ways we don't notice or thank Him for.

In 1905 Civilla Durfee Martin wrote the hymn "His Eye is on the Sparrow" which has been one of the most influential and often-recorded gospel hymns. The song was inspired by Matthew 6: 26: "Look at the birds of the air; they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they?" Later in Matthew 10: 29-31, the Gospel writer continues: "Are not two sparrows sold for a penny? And not one of them will fall to the ground without your Father's will. But even the hairs of your heard are all numbered."

Civilla Martin describes the context out of which the hymn was born: "Early in the spring of 1905, my husband and I were traveling in Elmira, New York. We developed a deep friendship for a couple by

the name of Mr. and Mrs. Doolittle—true saints of God. Mrs. Doolittle had been bedridden for almost twenty years. Her husband was an incurable cripple who had to propel himself to and from his business in a wheelchair. Despite their afflictions, they lived happy Christian lives, bringing inspiration and comfort to all who knew them. One day while we were visiting with the Doolittle's, my husband commented on their bright hopefulness and asked them for the secret of it. Mrs. Doolittle's response was simple: 'His eye is on the sparrow, and I know He watches me.' The beauty of this expression of boundless faith gripped my heart and fired my imagination. The hymn 'His Eye is on the Sparrow' was the outcome of that experience.

The next day Mrs. Martin mailed her poem to Charles Gabriel, a famous composer of gospel songs, who wrote a tune for it.

"Why should I feel discouraged? Why should the shadows come? Why should my heart be lonely and long for heaven and home? When Jesus is my portion? My constant friend is he; His eye is on the sparrow, and I know he watches me."

May God's providence be realized in our individual lives and in the life of our congregation as we glorify Christ and thank Him for his love and care.
