Dear Friends In Christ,

Last month our Sunday readings included Paul's words from the book of Romans. The readings were rich in Paul's convictions that we are loved by Christ and that nothing can separate us from that love.

In Romans 8, Paul asks, "What then, shall we say in response to these things? If God is for us,

who can be against us?" The "things" Paul is referring to are the teachings about salvation that he wrote about earlier, such as freedom from sin and death, the life-giving Spirit who lives in us, the new life we have as God's children, the promise of renewal despite suffering we may face today, and strength and hope for the future.

Faith in Christ does not remove all the struggles we encounter in life. Still, we know that "in all things God works for good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose." Somehow, even despite the bad things that happen in our lives, God works to conform us "to the image of His Son." This does not mean that we celebrate bad things in life, but it does mean that as we reflect and pray over our troubling times, we can see God's work in the midst of it all.

Paul's question "Who can be against us?" answers itself: *If God is for us, of course no one can be against us!* And Paul goes on to say, "In all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will ever be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord."

This means we can live a life of freedom! We don't have to be held back by feelings we don't measure up or that we're not enough. We don't have to wonder if our past decisions and actions have separated us from God's love. In Jesus, we are more than enough. Our worth comes from God rather than from others or from our experiences.

Let us be encouraged! Nothing can separate us from God's love. God never holds our sins against us. He has closed the case. May we choose to believe God over our feelings and fears. When we do, we'll experience freedom in Christ. Pastor Teri
