Dear Friends in Christ,

We live in a culture where press and news media, music, digital platforms, film and television, books, sports, art, celebrities, business and their products—all claim to know what's best and most important for us. But when the screens go blank, when the sounds are muted, when we yank our hand away from the world's tight grasp and place it on our hearts, whose voice do we hear? What do we declare as most important? It's a question we as followers of Christ must ask and answer not once, but every day. When we relinquish that power, the world is all too eager to assume it, to take it from us. We must decide each day that our thoughts, words, and actions will reflect the presence of Christ in our lives.

It's rarely an easy choice. That's why Jesus told would-be followers to count the cost. If we want easy, Jesus said, the world has plenty to offer. But none of it compares to the life we find in Jesus. Our commitment to Christ must be more important than anything else. It must be our highest priority. When it is, we begin to develop the proper perspective on ourselves, others, and things. We learn to let go of the past, of our guilt, of things that weigh us down. And we learn to cling tightly to Christ, whose presence and power enable us to declare, "No. This is what's important." And with that declaration, with that power and presence in our lives, we can move courageously onto a path we may not understand and into a future we cannot predict.

Lent begins February 14 with Ash Wednesday as we worship together at 7:00 pm. The following

week, February 21, we will have our first soup supper at 6:00 followed by a brief worship service. Our mid-week Lenten worship services will challenge you to answer questions that lie at the heart of discipleship: Is following Jesus the most important thing to you? Is it your priority? When you follow Jesus, how does it change the way you think, speak, and act? Each week we will look at the heart of a committed disciple:

February 14: Ash Wednesday Worship

February 21: A Humble Heart February 28: A Committed Heart

March 6: A Gracious Heart March 13: A Purposeful Heart

March 20: A Heart of Extravagant Love March 28: Maundy Thursday Worship

March 29: Good Friday Worship;

March 31: Easter Sunday Sunrise and Brunch I look forward to our Lenten journey as together we re-commit ourselves to following Jesus Christ. Pastor Teri




