Pastor's Report: Made many calls, prepared for Holy Week and Lent services,


Confirmation class continues, Graduation of Carter, MJ needs a break from providing music, Baptisms scheduled for April 27 and 28, 2024.

I greet you in the name of our resurrected Savior, Jesus Christ! We have experienced a glorious Easter Sunday and are still basking in the glow of the good news. In Matthew's Resurrection account, the women went off with great fear and excitement to tell the disciples after seeing that the tomb was empty. In John's Resurrection account, Mary Magdalene tells the disciples about Jesus' missing body. These women were the first human evangelists after the Resurrection. The good news of the Resurrection must be told. It is not a secret. It's not just a major news flash. Jesus has been raised! Go and tell!

It's astounding how many modern people are skeptical of the message of Resurrection. It is hard to believe that there was a time when you had to pay people to *disbelieve* in the resurrection. Nowadays, disbelief in resurrection seems to be the official position of many. Never underestimate the human predisposition for doubt and skepticism. There will always be an attempt to explain the unexplainable, to put the Resurrection in relatable terms. But instead of arguing and trying to prove the Resurrection, we Christians are better off believing by faith and then living as those for whom the Resurrection has changed everything.


I remember as a child making up games with my younger brother. As the oldest child, I was the


author of the rules, what could and couldn't be done. That also gave me a certain power to change the rules along the way. "It's my game, I made the rules. I can change them if I want."

The Resurrection is a striking reminder that God made the rules and God reserves the right to decide what can and can't happen. Thankfully, God has decided to set loose the Resurrection power all over creation! So the rules have changed. Death doesn't have the last word. Easter isn't just about a dead body that comes back to life. Easter is about resurrection, and resurrection changes everything. The resurrected Christ takes away all our fears. He overcomes everything we have to fear, including death. And he meets us where we need him on this road of life. Thanks be to God!

Don't be afraid. He is risen! Go and tell!
